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
# What is the Broset Violence Checklist?

The Broset Violence Checklist (BVC) is used to assess and monitor Behavioral Health patients for the presence of agitation and violence. The score obtained from the BVC assists providers in determining medical interventions to mitigate/prevent agitation or violence the patient may demonstrate.

• The Broset is only meant for use in the ED and the MMC D6 (Behavioral Health) unit.

# **Documentation of the Broset Violence Checklist for Nurses**

The BVC can be accessed from the Triage form (in the ED), Ad Hoc or from a task



The most recent BVC Score displays on ED LaunchPoint:





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#### **BVC Nurse Task**

The BVC tasking rules depend on the patient's location (ED or MMC-D6):

#### **ED** BVC Tasks Trigger:

- Upon order of a Broset PowerPlan
- Q1 hour for a BVC form score of 3 or greater
- Q4 hour for a BVC form score of less than 3

### MMC-D6 BVC Tasks Trigger:

- On admission (all patients)
- Q shift (all patients)
- Q1 hour for a BVC score form of 3 or greater (existing Q shift order is canceled)

### **Broset PowerPlans**

Nurse: Verbal notification to the provider to order the Broset PowerPlans for + BVC scores

Provider: Order the Broset Sub-Phase (selection depending on the Patient's age) within the ED Psych Med Clearance/Overdose PowerPlan:





NOTE: ED Patients with a long length of stay may need to have the Broset Sub-Phases reordered as the medication orders include stop times

- Each section (antipsychotics, Benzodiazepines, etc.) has several choices based on the score
- Each Medication Sub-Phase guides the nurse on what medication to administer based on the score
