



MHC Hospitalization Trends



COVID-19 Vaccine

Current total for each location:

- Cadillac Hospital: **389**
- Grayling Hospital: **345**
- Munson Medical Center (Traverse City): **2,717**
- Paul Oliver Memorial Hospital: **69 (Started vaccines 12/28)**
- Otsego Memorial Hospital: **179 (Started vaccines 12/28)**
- Charlevoix and Manistee Vaccine Clinics open 12/29



COVID-19 Vaccine

As of Dec 29 at 8:00am, **3,693** Healthcare Team members have received their first vaccine.

- # Pfizer – 3,464 doses *administered*
- # Moderna – 229 doses *administered*

- **4971 MHC employees and credentialed providers currently vaccinated or scheduled (note: includes contracted staff)**
- **48 % of eligible employees and credentialed providers vaccinated or scheduled**

COVID-19 Vaccine

Munson Healthcare Status

- **By January 1, a total of 9,750 Pfizer doses will have been received.**
- **By January 1, a total of 2,800 Moderna doses will have been received.**
- **Pfizer shipments to arrive today (12/29) at MMC, Cadillac, and Kalkaska.**
- **Moderna doses will be delivered to Paul Oliver this week.**



COVID-19 Vaccine

**Number of phone calls to the COVID-19 Vaccine Scheduling Center To Date:
5,296 (since opening on 12/16/2020)**

- When the vaccine arrived, Munson Healthcare had been scheduling members of the Healthcare Team for their COVID-19 vaccinations beginning with patient-facing employees and credentialed providers.
- As of Thursday, December 24, COVID-19 Vaccination Clinics opened to all Employees and Credentialed Providers
- Patients should not experience any phone issues when calling MHC facilities



MHC Vaccine Prioritization

- Tier 1a: Healthcare Personnel and Long Term Care Residents
- Tier 1b: Essential Workers: People who play a key role in keeping essential functions of society running and cannot socially distance in the workplace (e.g., Education Sector, Food & Agriculture, Utilities, Police, Firefighters, Corrections Officers, Transportation) Adults 75 years and older
- Tier 1c: High Risk Adults People (See next slide for update)
- Tier 2: General Population


COVID-19 Vaccine Priority Levels



MHC Vaccine Prioritization

- **Tier 1c: High Risk Adults. Phase 1C has changed slightly:**
 - People aged 65 and older
 - People aged 16 and older with underlying medical conditions
 - Other essential workers (such as people who work in transportation and logistics, food service, housing construction and finance, information technology, communications, energy, law, media, public safety, and public health)
- **Tier 2: General Population**

COVID-19 Vaccine Priority Levels



mRNA COVID-19 Vaccine Updated Recommendations

- **Should not be given within 90 days of someone having received COVID-19 Convalescent plasma or a monoclonal antibody.**
- **People who have tested positive for COVID-19 can receive the vaccine at any time as long as you are not acutely ill.**
- **Wait two weeks between receiving other vaccinations.**

As the COVID-19 vaccines are made available in the coming weeks, Munson Healthcare is working closely with our regional health departments and the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) on a nearly daily basis to help distribute the vaccines to EMS workers, hospital staff caring for COVID-19 patients in our emergency rooms and hospitals, as well as workers and residents in long-term care facilities.

As we learn more from the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and MDHHS, we will continue to keep you updated. 

- **Focus of Distribution Plan**

- EMS/First Responders
- Long Term Care & Congregate Care Facilities (not contracted with pharmacies)
- Medical providers (outside of hospital) in early January

- **What to know:**

- We are working our way through Phase 1A priority subgroups 1 & 2
- We are planning and gathering numbers for priority group 1A subgroup 3
- We will be planning ongoing for larger clinics for Phase 1B and beyond

- **Focus of Distribution Plan**

- Last week, DHD#10 received our initial shipment of the Moderna vaccine from the state and some Pfizer vaccine from Grand Traverse County Health Department
- We began vaccinating Phase 1A priority group, including:
 - 80 DHD#10 frontline staff
 - 128 residents and staff of Manistee County Medical Care
 - 8 EMS workers from Manistee County
- This week, we continue to focus on EMS, Medical First Responders and residents of long-term care facilities and assisted livings
 - So far this week we have administered:
 - 60 doses in Mason County
 - 70 doses in Mecosta County
 - 40 doses in Missaukee County
 - 30 doses in Oceana County

- Clinics are scheduled today and throughout the week for Crawford, Kankaska, Lake, Newaygo, and Wexford counties
- DHD#10 will continue to focus on Phase 1A and is coordinating with employers and organizations directly for clinic dates, times, and locations.
