



# Who is eligible for an extra dose of COVID-19 vaccine?

Remember to bring a copy of your COVID-19 vaccine record with you to your appointment.

Some people may prefer a different vaccine type for their booster; mixing and matching is allowed.





If you are **immunocompromised** and have had your initial 2 doses of Pfizer or Moderna, get a 3<sup>rd</sup> dose at least **28 days** after dose 2.

If your initial 2 doses were **Pfizer** or **Moderna**, you qualify for a booster dose at least **6 months** after dose 2 if:



Talk to your doctor about your individual benefits and risks.

If your initial dose was **Johnson & Johnson** and you are 18+ years, you qualify for a booster dose at least **2 months** after your initial dose.

# **Booster Shot Eligibility and Authorizations**

#### May Get a Booster

• Employees and residents at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure and transmission.

#### Examples of workers who may get booster shots:

- First responders (e.g., healthcare workers, firefighters, police, congregate care staff)
- Education staff (e.g., teachers, support staff, daycare workers)
- Food and agriculture workers
- Manufacturing workers
- Corrections workers
- U.S. Postal Service workers
- Public transit workers
- Grocery store workers



The FDA is to meeting today (Oct. 26) to discuss an amendment to Pfizer emergency use authorization to allow the use of its COVID-19 vaccine in children 5 through 11 years of age.

# Munson Healthcare Partners with LabCorp for Asymptomatic COVID-19 Testing Option

In an effort to increase community access to COVID-19 testing, MHC has partnered with LabCorp and will be offering PCR COVID-19 testing services at Foster Family Community Health Center (FFCHC) Library.

- Who: Individuals who do not have COVID-19 symptoms (this is <u>not</u> an option for an individual who has received an exposure notice).
- When: Walk-in hours are Mon. Fri. from 8:00 am 4:30 pm.
- Where: FFCHC Library, 550 Munson Avenue, Suite #0103.

#### More information:

- No doctor's order needed. This PCR test is an out-of-pocket expense for the patient (\$51.31).
- Patients can purchase the test kit from FFCHC Pharmacy and then proceed to the Library for swab testing.
- Results are available within 72 hours via the LabCorp patient portal.
- Munson Healthcare will call all patients with positive results and add positive results to our patients' Electronic Health Records.

## Munson Healthcare's Monoclonal Antibody Therapy Program

- Munson Healthcare's monoclonal antibody therapy program is experiencing resource constraints.
- With our region's positivity rate hovering at 17% (last spring's surge reached 17.7%), MHC's monoclonal antibody therapy program is continuously receiving a significant number of patient referrals from our medical community and from our self-referral program.
- The current volume of patients who meet the criteria for therapy exceeds the number of appointments available so not all patients will be able to be treated.
- Every health system in the state of Michigan is facing these same challenges.
- At this time, MidMichigan Health and Spectrum Health are the only options available beyond Munson Healthcare. All other northern Michigan programs have ceased operations.

## **COVID-19 and the Flu**

Both the seasonal flu and COVID-19 share many similar symptoms. So what can you do?

First, protect yourself and others. Take the single most important action against both illnesses by getting both your COVID-19 vaccine AND your flu shot, which can be done in one doctor's visit.

In addition, both illnesses can be prevented with the following measures:

- Mask up in public
- Wash your hands often
- Practice physical distancing of 6-feet or more in public
- Stay home if you feel ill
- Avoid people who are sick



- **Mild to Moderate Symptoms:** Please stay home and <u>get tested</u> so you know for certain whether or not you have COVID-19, the flu, or something else.
- Severe Symptoms: Seek immediate care by calling your doctor or dialing 9-1-1.

#### **Masking Recommendations**



- Masking protects both you and those around you.
- Since COVID-19 has a high viral load it is very transmissible.



#### **GTCHD** continues free COVID-19 diagnostic testing:

#### This week: Tuesday and Thursday from 9 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. and 1 - 4:00 p.m.

- Testing is drive-up and is done in the parking lot behind the main building, under the carports
- Location: 2600 LaFranier Rd. Traverse City, MI, 49686
- Hours vary week to week depending on staffing check social media and <u>www.gtcountymi.gov/2211</u> for current schedule and link to appointments
- Results are delivered electronically (email/text) within two hours
- PCR Tests are taking up to 72 hours to return results
- This is diagnostic testing for those with symptoms or exposed, not travel testing





### **District Health Department #10 COVID-19 Case Trends**



- Cases decreasing (-14.9%): October 9- October 15= 893 cases; October 16 October 22 = 760 cases
- Daily cases per million **decreasing**: October 7= **417**; October 14= **404.5**
- Percent positivity **slightly decreasing**: October 7= **14.4%**; October 14= **14.3%**



## **District Health Department #10 COVID-19 Vaccination Trends**

- 59.8% of DHD#10 residents have initiated vaccination
- 55.9% of DHD#10 residents have completed vaccination series
- Map shows vaccination rates among 16+ age group by zip code
  - Darker pink = lower vaccination rate
