

## **CME Requirements for Physicians**

MD Licensing Requirements: 150 hours every three years -

- 1 hour must be in the area of medical ethics
- A minimum of 3 hours must be in the area of pain and symptom management
  - o At least 1 of these 3 credits must include **controlled substance prescribing**.

<u>DO Licensing Requirements</u>: 150 hours every three years – of which, a minimum of 60 hours must be earned through Category 1 programs –

- 1 hour must be in the area of medical ethics
- A minimum of 3 hours must be in the area of pain and symptom management
  - At least 1 of these 3 credits must include controlled substance prescribing.

<u>DDS/DMD Licensing Requirements</u>: 60 hours every three years – of which, a minimum of 20 hours must be devoted to clinical issues, including delivery of care, materials used in delivery of care, and pharmacology –

- 1 hour must be in the area of dental ethics and jurisprudence with inclusion of delegation of duties to allied dental personnel.
- 1 hour must be in the area of infection control, which must include: sterilization of hand pieces, personal protective equipment, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's infection control guidelines
- A minimum of 3 hours must be in the area of pain and symptom management
  - At least 1 of these 3 credits must include controlled substance prescribing.

## **DPM Licensing Requirements:** 150 hours every three years –

- 1 hour must be in the area of medical ethics
- A minimum of 3 hours must be in the area of pain and symptom management
  - At least 2 credits must include controlled substance prescribing.

All MDs, DOs, and DDS/DMDs have a one-time requirement of training in identifying victims of human trafficking.

A physician seeking a controlled substance license, or who is licensed to prescribe or dispense controlled substances, must complete a **one-time** training in **opioids and controlled substance awareness** prior to being issued a controlled substance license.

\*NEW\* Beginning on June 1, 2022, and for every renewal thereafter, any applicant for license or registration renewal must have completed a minimum of 1 hour of implicit bias training for each year of the applicant's license or registration cycle.
