Sepsis/Septic Shock Algorithm

Severe Sepsis and Septic Shock Criteria

Possible or Suspected Infection:

Any sign or symptom infection might be present: cough, fever, chills, malaise, dysuria, altered mental status, headache, fatigue, "not feeling well," abdominal pain, vomiting, diarrhea, purulent wound.



SIRS (at least 2)

Temp < 36 or > 38.3 HR > 90 RR > 20 WBC < 4 or > 12 Bands > 10%



New Organ Dysfunction (at least 1):

Lactate > 2

SBP < 90 or MAP < 65

Creatinine > 2.0

Bilirubin > 2.0

Platelets < 100

INR > 1.5 or PTT > 60

Acute need for NIV/Vent support

Septic Shock: Infection + SIRS + Lactate ≥ 4 or persistent hypotension following fluid bolus

If patient meets these criteria, Initiate Sepsis Bundle Immediately.

TIME ZERO is when ALL the above criteria are first present.

↓ START

- 1. Draw serum lactate STAT
- 2. Draw blood cultures prior to giving antibiotics STAT
- 3. Start broad spectrum IV antibiotics STAT

↓ AND

Is patient hypotensive within 6 hours of TIME ZERO? OR lactate \geq 4?

4. Give 30 ml/kg NS or LR bolus STAT over 60-90 minutes.

Provider may choose less than 30ml/kg if:

- 1. Clinical indication for less fluid present. Both volume ordered and indication MUST be documented in a single note. **OR**
- 2. If BMI is > 30, IBW may be used to dose. IBW MUST be recorded and documented in reference to sepsis bolus in a single note.

No repeat **R** needed. **v**

Repeat lactate within 6 hours of time zero.

6 Hour Bundle

Must be completed within 6 hours of Time Zero



↓ THEN

Is patient hypotensive in the hour following bolus?



YES

- 5. Start a vasopressor if SBP < 90 or MAP < 65
- 6. Perform sepsis reassessment

Provider must document in a note after the fluid bolus:

- 1. "Sepsis reassessment performed." **OR**
- 2. Focused exam or review of systems **OR**
- 3. Document CVP, echo, or fluid challenge

7. Ensure repeat lactate drawn

If initial lactate > 2, repeat must be drawn within 6 hours of time zero.
