

# Hierarchical Condition Categories for Providers and Clinical Staff

#### Cerner PowerChart Ambulatory EDUCATION

**Summary:** When a chronic condition is added to the Workflow Problem List component, the condition is mapped to an ICD-10-CM code to determine whether the condition qualifies as hierarchical condition category (HCC). As such, the Problem List will have black or red lettering appear. All primary care offices (clinical or provider staff) must address HCCs as part of their workflow. Specialists' offices will see this information as well but are not expected to address at this time.

**Hierarchical Condition Category Indicators** 

If a diagnosis is an HCC condition, the Workflow Problem List component displays an HCC indicator in parentheses next to the problem. If the condition was added to an encounter in the previous or current calendar year and has been addressed in the current calendar year, the condition is considered validated. This is indicated with a **black** HCC indicator next to the condition name.


Problem Name

(HCC) Diabetes

A **red** HCC indicator is displayed if the condition was added to an encounter in the previous calendar year but has not been addressed in the current calendar year. A message also is displayed on the Information banner when overdue HCCs require attention.
